
This holiday season, we invite you to bring a little Main Street, U.S.A. spirit home with your own Magic Kingdom® Park Holiday Wreath.

MATERIALS GUIDE Lines Glue Scissors Cut Crayons String



Please Note: When cutting with scissors and working with any of the materials listed above, adult participation and supervision is recommended.

- Sheet 1: see for Optional Instructions. Please note: you can use any form you'd like to make 1. the wreath. Embroidery hoops, wreath hoops covered in paper, or cardboard can all work!
- Color the sheets however you'd like! For this activity, we recommend using a hot glue gun 2. for durability, but regular glue will also work.
- 3. Sheets 2 8: Cut out and fold the leaves and branches. It is not necessary to use all the leaves; you can feel free to use whichever you prefer. We recommend using the Pine Branches on Sheet 2 and Sheet 3 as a base layer. Glue them to your chosen hoop, going around the circle in one direction. Add smaller individual leaves or branches on top. You can be artistic with how you arrange and layer!
- 4. Sheets 9 - 12: Each of these sheets will have their own instructions so you can create any mix of elements you'd like!
- 5. To finish: Add Box to the front. The Candle can only be placed if you follow the Optional Instructions. If you're making a flatter piece, you can add the Flat Candle instead! Attach a ribbon or string to the back, and your wreath is ready to hang!






OPTIONAL INSTRUCTIONS: WREATH BASE STRUCTURE

1. Use a foam wreath form or cut a hoop out of cardboard. The width of the hoop should be 2 1/2". The diameter can be as big or small as you'd like.













- 2. Take a plain letter-sized paper and fold it in half along the short edge. Open it up and fold the ends into the center. Now the sheet is divided into 4 parts.
- 3. Fold the paper in half again and cut 1/2" wide slits from the center crease to the folded line.
- Overlap the uncut parts. This will form a (triangular) prism shape.
- Wrap the triangular form around the cardboard hoop, making sure the uncut face is on the inside. Tape or glue into place. Use as many sheets as necessary to cover the entire hoop.


Note: You can also just use a cardboard hoop without additional structure, an embroidery hoop, a foam wreath hoop, or anything else you'd like!




















