

DISNEY'S FORT WILDERNESS RESORT & CAMPGROUND

CAMPSITE AND CABIN RULES



GUEST-INITIATED ACTIVITIES

- The sale, advertisement, solicitation or display of goods or services is prohibited unless prior written approval by Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort & Campground has been obtained.
- Providing bartending services, selling or serving alcohol to members of the public or other Guests at the resort and campground is strictly prohibited.
- Guest-initiated events or activities that may impede the operation of Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort & Campground, including but not limited to, activities that may obstruct, block or impact parking areas, sidewalks, driveways, roadways or traffic throughout the resort and campground, are prohibited. We reserve the right to prohibit, cancel, suspend or otherwise restrict Guest-initiated events or activities without prior notice and without refund, liability or compensation, to ensure safety, security or order, or if we consider that the circumstances otherwise so require, in our sole and absolute discretion.

GOLF CART AND RV POLICY

- When renting an RV, there are several **Disney Featured Providers** that Guests can use. If Guests choose to rent through one of these providers, the Guest does not need to be present when the equipment is delivered to the resort. The provider will work with Disney Resort Cast Members to manage deliveries, set-up and returns of rented RVS.
- If Guests are bringing in their own RV, it must be brought in by the registered Guest.
- Golf carts are available to rent right from Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort & Campground. Guests can make a reservation in advance by calling 407-824-2742, based on availability. Upon arrival, Guests can visit the Outpost to pickup their golf cart right at the resort.
- Third-party companies may not conduct business at *Walt Disney World*®.
- If Guests should bring their own golf cart, Guests must be prepared to present proof of golf cart liability insurance with minimum limits of **\$100,000 / \$300,000** and sign an agreement and waiver.

GENERAL VEHICLE RULES

- Obey all posted traffic signs (such as, speed limits) and the rules and regulations established by Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort & Campground. Watch for bicycles, pedestrians and other vehicular traffic.
- All vehicles must adhere to "school bus" policies; all traffic must come to a full and complete stop (including oncoming traffic) until all passengers boarding and disembarking a bus are clear. Traffic will resume when the bus starts moving.
- Drivers may not have open containers of alcohol while operating vehicles, nor be under the influence of alcohol, chemical substances or controlled substances.
- The use of any electronic communication device to send or read text messages, emails or any other written communication while operating a vehicle is prohibited.
- A hands-free device must be used for all cellular phone calls while operating a vehicle.

GENERAL CART RULES

- Follow the General Vehicle Rules above.
- All **Florida Rules of the Road** apply while operating carts on Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort & Campground property, whether privately owned or a *Walt Disney World* rental.
- Cart drivers must be at least 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license. The license must remain with the driver at all times while operating the cart. Driver's Learner Permits are not acceptable.
- Children are not permitted to sit on the driver's lap. Young children may sit on the passenger's lap while being secured by the passenger.
- Every passenger must sit in a seat at all times. No standing.
- Children may not assist in driving the cart at any time.
- Carts must stay within Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort & Campground. Carts should only be parked in designated cart parking areas.
- Carts must remain on roadways and designated cart paths only. Off-roading is prohibited.
- Larger vehicles have the "right of way". Carts must yield to larger vehicles. Keep to the right on roadways to allow larger vehicles to pass and yield to pedestrians.

Golf cart privileges at Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort & Campground may be revoked from those not abiding by the above rules and regulations.

PRIVATE CART RULES

- Follow General Vehicle and General Cart Rules above.
- Must be golf style carts; Off-road, ATV, utility or construction-type carts are not permitted.
- Maximum speed must not exceed 20 MPH.
- Must be equipped with head and taillights to operate after dusk.

MOTORCYCLES, NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLES (NEV) AND GLOBAL ELECTRIC MOTORCARS (GEM)

- Follow General Vehicle Rules above.
- Remain on roadways and not on sidewalks.
- Parking is prohibited in designated golf cart areas.
- Must be equipped with head and taillights to operate after dusk.

BICYCLES AND RECREATIONAL DEVICES

- Bicycles must be equipped with head and taillights to operate after dusk.
- Bicycles may only be used on designated sidewalks and paths.
- Bicycles must be manually powered.
- Florida State law requires that all bike riders under the age of 16 wear a bike helmet.
- Prohibited items include (but are not limited to):
 - Electric/electric-assisted bicycles
 - Recreational devices such as drones, remote-control toys, skateboards, scooters, inline skates or shoes with built-in wheels
 - Personal watercraft
 - Wheeled mobility devices with less than 3 wheels or devices that cannot maintain stability and balance when stopped, unpowered and/or unoccupied
- Training wheels and/or modifications are not permitted.
- Devices must be manually or electrically powered and operated at a walking pace.
- Devices should be single rider and not exceed 36" (92 cm) in width and 52" (132 cm) in length.

CAMPFIRES

In addition to offering Chip 'n' Dale's Campfire Sing-A-Long, personal fire pits for recreational fires are welcome at your campsite or cabin as long as the following conditions are met:

- Fire pits must be contained within a fire pit device with metal sides and covered with a metal or mesh top to prevent logs/embers from escaping when in use. The flame height must be controlled.
- Wood, coal, artificial fire logs, and propane are the only permissible fire sources.
- Fire pits must be kept away from your cabin, tent walls, RV, shrubs, and other flammable materials.
- Fire pits cannot have a fire bay larger than 2-ft x 3-ft (length x width).
- Fire pits must be attended at all times with an accessible water source.
- Once you are done enjoying your campfire, flames must be fully extinguished with no embers remaining.

Based on environmental conditions and other factors, outdoor activities, including use of personal fire pits, may be prohibited at any time without notice.
